Doris B. Dann was born on February 3, 1933, in Gaylord, Michigan. A figure of remarkable dedication, she left an indelible mark on the City of El Monte through her tireless service, community particularly with Our Saviour Center.

In 1985, the Church of Our Saviour in San Gabriel founded Our Saviour Center, initially a modest food bank. Doris Dann, deeply committed to serving those in need, expanded this initiative into a multifaceted community resource. She understood the profound challenges faced by the residents of El Monte, an area grappling with poverty, crime, and limited opportunities.

Under Dann's leadership, Our Saviour Center broadened its scope to include vital services beyond food distribution.

In 1989, she spearheaded the establishment of youth development programs to provide academic support and enrichment activities for local children.

Her efforts culminated in the opening of the Dorris Dann Kids Campus (DDKC) in 2006. This 18,000 square foot facility features a gymnasium, tutoring and performing arena, computer lab, art studio, and classrooms. The DDKC offers afterschool and summer programs designed to enhance academic and social development through sports, arts, and community engagement.

Doris Dann's vision and dedication to the community were further evidenced by her ability to secure grants and donations to support these initiatives.

The programs she developed have significantly impacted the lives of countless children, providing them with a safe and nurturing environment to learn and grow.

Sadly, Doris Dann passed away on January 9, 2002, in a hospital in San Gabriel, California, due to natural

# A Brief History of Rosemead



Nestled in the San Gabriel Valley, the city of Rosemead, California, boasts a rich history that traces back to the early days of Spanish exploration and the subsequent growth of the state. By the late 19th and early 20th centuries, Rosemead's agricultural landscape was dotted with citrus groves, walnut trees, and other crops. The arrival of the railroad further boosted the area's economy, allowing local farmers to transport their produce to larger markets.




